Course Description: Exploration of music of the Romantic era through analysis of relevant works and compositional exercises. Topics include advanced modulations, mode mixture, Neapolitan and augmented-sixth chords, common-tone diminished chords, and extended tonality.

- If I call on you twice in a class and you do not respond either time, I will mark you absent (unexcused).



Homework:

- Homework assignments will be available on Blackboard. Print them out and complete them with a pencil, **working by yourself**. All assignments should be submitted as a PDF (take a picture or scan them) into the appropriate Blackboard homework folder *before* the class they are due.
- Late Homework: **No late homework will be accepted** unless you have contacted me before the due date and I grant you an extension.
- The lowest 2 homework grades will be dropped.
- If you have a question about the homework, come to office hours (Thursdays 1:30-3:30 via Zoom). If you cannot attend, please email me. I will generally get back to you within 24 hours.

Quizzes: We will have short pop quizzes in class every so often. These cannot be retaken after the class ends.

Midterm: On 10/25, 12:25pm, your midterm composition project will be due. You will submit a draft of it by 9/13. There is an extra credit opportunity embedded within the midterm—if you make it longer and/or get a good video or audio recording of your piece *and* play it for the class on 10/25, you will get up to 7% extra credit points added to your final grade. Details about this will be on Blackboard.

Final Exam: The final exam will be on 12/15 from 1:00-3:00pm, in person.* It will be cumulative. A practice test will be provided, and time will be dedicated to in-class review.
